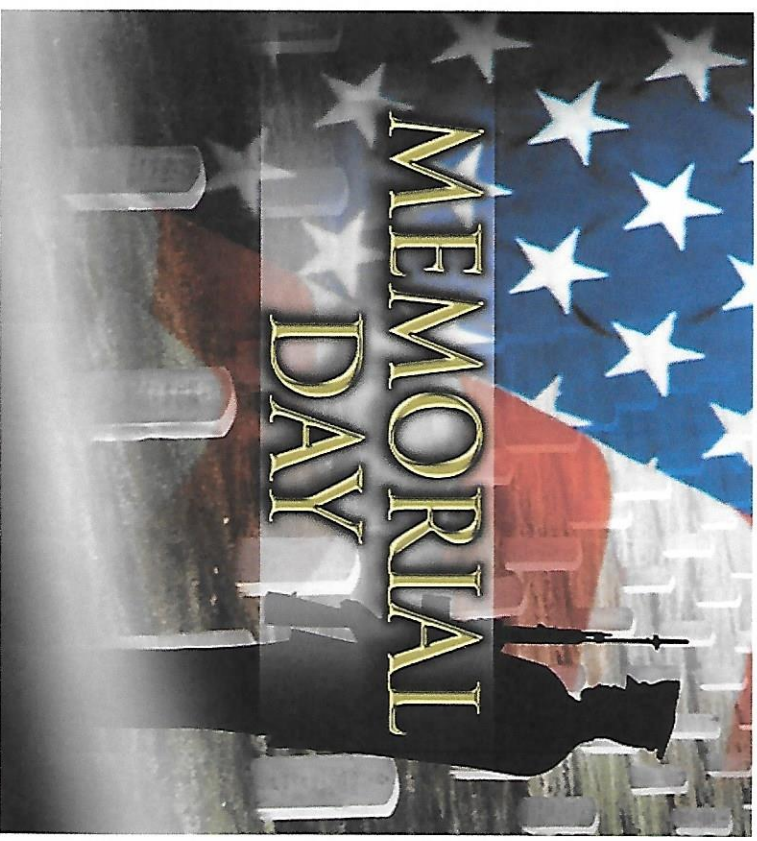
History

The German Lutheran Cemetery was established in 1858 by Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Saint Paul. In 1872 the current location on Dale St. was purchased and in 1920 was renamed to Elmhurst Cemetery to reflect the increased ethnic inclusion. The cemetery remained much as it was almost 100 years ago. Trinity created St. John's German Evangelical Lutheran Church as a "daughter congregation" in 1871, followed by Emmanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church in 1873. Just 10 years ago, Trinity and Emmanuel merged to become Crown of Life Evangelical Lutheran Church.
